

## **LINE 16 ADDENDUM A**

**2001 (July-December)**

### **S. 552**

To provide that no electric utility shall be required to enter into a new contract or obligation to purchase or to sell electricity or capacity under section 210 of the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978.

### **H. R. 1045**

To lower energy costs to consumers, increase electric system reliability and provide environmental improvements, through the rapid deployment of distributed energy resources, and for other purposes.

### **H.R.3406**

To benefit consumers and enhance the Nation's energy security by removing barriers the development of competitive markets for electric power; providing for the reliability and increased capacity of the Nation's electric transmission networks, promoting the use of renewable and alternative sources of electric power generation, and for other purposes.

### **H.R.3274**

To provide assistance to those individuals most affected by high energy prices and to promote and accelerate energy conservation investments in the United States.
