HR 3699 – Federal and D.C. Government Property Act of 2005—A bill to provide for the sale, acquisition, conveyance, and exchange of certain real property in the District of Columbia to facilitate the utilization, development, and redevelopment of such property, and for other purposes; Interested in Davis-Bacon Act implications.

HR 4100 – Louisiana Recovery Act—To establish the Louisiana Recovery Corporation for purposes of economic stabilization and redevelopment of devastated areas in Louisiana, and for other purposes. Interested in Davis-Bacon application to projects funded under the bill.

H.R. 2041—Homeland Security Grant Enhancement Act of 2005—To provide for homeland security grant coordination and simplification, and for other purposes. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects funded under the bill.

H.R. 3673—Second Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act to Meet Immediate Needs Arising From Consequences of Hurricane Katrina, 2005—Making further emergency supplemental appropriations to meet immediate needs arising from the consequences of Hurricane Katrina, for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2005, and for other purposes— Interested in Davis-Bacon application to projects funded under the bill.

H.R. 3717—Good Samaritan Protection for Construction Volunteers Act—To provide construction contract qualified immunity from liability for negligence when providing services or equipment on a volunteer basis in response to a declared emergency or disaster—Interested in implications for construction workers.

H.R. 4979 – Local Community Recovery Act—To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act to clarify the preference for local firms in the award of certain contracts for disaster relief and recovery— Interested in Davis-Bacon application to projects funded under the bill.

H.R. 4954—SAFE Port Act—To improve maritime and cargo security through enhanced layered defenses and other purposes— Interested in Davis-Bacon application to projects funded under the bill.

H.R. 4318 – Outer Continental Shelf Natural Gas Relief Act of 2006—To terminate the effect of all provisions of Federal law that prohibit the expenditure of appropriated funds to conduct natural gas leasing and prelease activities for any area of the Outer Continental Shelf, to terminate all withdrawals of Federal submerged lands from the Outer Continental Shelf from leasing for exploration for, and development and production of, natural gas and other purposes— Interested in application of Immigration and Nationality Act to foreign workers hired on vehicles attached to the seabed involved in oil and gas exploration.

H.R. 4761 – Deep Ocean Energy Resources Development Act of 2006—To provide for exploration, development and production activities for mineral resources on the outer Continental Shelf, and for other purposes—In addition, interested in application of Immigration and Nationality Act to foreign workers hired to work on vehicles attached to the seabed involved in oil and gas exploration and in grants for joint apprenticeship programs.

H.R. 5427—Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act, 2007—Making appropriations for energy and water development for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2007, and for other purposes — Interested in proposed prohibition against use of appropriated funds to reimburse contractors for costs associated with contractors' defined pension benefit plans and medical benefit plans.

S. 852, S. 3274 – The Fair Asbestos Injury Resolution Act – Two versions of a bill to provide compensation to victims of asbestos exposure, by establishing a national trust fund financed by entities with asbestos liability. Interested in all provisions, including establishment of fund, funding levels, compensation levels, eligibility requirements, and compensation awards.

S. 2057—Investing for Tomorrow's Schools Act of 2005—A bill to establish State infrastructure banks for education, and for other purposes— Interested in Davis-Bacon application to projects funded under the bill

S. 1033 – Secure America and Orderly Immigration Act of 2005—A bill to improve border security and immigration— Interested in guest worker provisions, including prevailing wage protections and employment of undocumented workers.

S. 1918—Strengthening America's Workforce Act of 2005—A bill to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to address the demand for foreign workers— Interested in guest worker provisions, including prevailing wage protections and employment of undocumented workers.
