TO OUR VALUED CUSTOMERS IN THE FEDERAL AGENCIES

Dear Sir or Madam:


This letter is being sent to you to explain the circumstances pertaining to the accompanying mail. You can see these items took an exceptionally long time to reach you. The Postal Service—and especially us who serve you in Washington, DC—take pride in providing our customers with the best possible service. We know that events over the past year have been very disruptive, and to minimize the impact on our customers, we have spared no effort to ensure our challenges with the loss of our principle mail facility do not affect our service to you. Recently, we redesigned our mail sanitization process to reduce the time necessary to complete it and to minimize its effect on your mail.

Despite these efforts, disruptions such as those brought on by the anthrax attack last year often result in unexpected consequences. We recently became aware that a mail receiving agency had been hit by a fire in its warehouse in town, possibly since last winter. We do not know the reason this action was taken, but most of this mail has been moved on its way to delivery. However, during the week of December 11, 2001, we received returned quantities of this mail to the Postal Service. The mail accompanying this letter is one of these returns.

Due to the extreme age of some of this mail we could not be certain that all of it had previously been sanitized prior to delivery. Therefore, in the interest of your safety, we have held this mail a few days longer than it could be sent for sanitization and redistributed for delivery to you.

The events of last fall were unprecedented in our national history and we can understand how our circumstances can lead to this type of event. In this case I felt these unusual circumstances warranted an explanation to you as a recipient. On behalf of the Postal Service and all the employees of the Washington Post Office, I want to express our regret for any inconvenience this situation may have caused you.
