## Specific Lobbying Issues

H.R. 1270, Nuclear Waste – Promoted legislation requiring DOE to comply with it's obligation to build and operate interim and permanent storage facilities for spent commercial nuclear waste. Educated members on the essential contribution nuclear generation makes to the national electric supply.

H.B. 2900, Clean Smokestacks Act – Opposed legislation on grounds that the fundamental assertion of the bill is that existing power plants have not be upgraded since their initial construction. The Clean Air Act, and most recently the Amendments of 1990, compelled all utilities to make significant improvements to pollution control equipment at power plants. Educated members on the pollution control expenditures and the resulting air quality improvements.

S.B. 1287, Nuclear Waste – Promoted legislation requiring DOE to comply with it's obligation to build and operate interim and permanent storage facilities for spent commercial nuclear waste. Educated members on the essential contribution nuclear generation makes to the national electric supply.
