Advocated for extension of the 15-year recovery period for the depreciation of certain leasehold improvements, expanded expensing of environmental remediation costs, and an extension of the Work Opportunity Tax Credit. HR 4480, "America's Brownfield Cleanup Act". Amends the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide tax incentives for the remediation of contaminated sites. All provisions. HR 877 and S 398, Amends the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the expensing of environmental remediation costs. All provisions. HR 4155 and HR 4440, "Gulf Opportunity Zone Act of 2005". Provisions concerning tax exempt bond financing, expensing and bonus depreciation for certain demolition and clean-up costs, extension and expansion of expensing for environmental remediation costs, increase in the rehabilitation credit, and five-year carryback period for net operating losses HR 1010 and S 580, Amends the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow certain modifications to be made to qualified mortgages held by a REMIC or a grantor trust.
