(IMMIGRATION) Due Process for Immigrants

- H.R. 1485. *Family Reunification Act of 1999* - Amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to revise the conditions under which the Attorney General may cancel the removal of certain aliens from the United States, including cancellation of removal for humanitarian or public benefit reasons for certain aliens convicted of aggravated felonies.
- H.R. 2999. *Fairness for Permanent Residents Act of 1999* - To permit the Attorney General to grant relief to certain permanent resident aliens of good moral character who are adversely affected by changes made in 1996 to the definition of aggravated felony under the Immigration and Nationality Act.
- S. 3120. *Immigrant Fairness Restoration Act of 2000* - amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to revise specified restrictions respecting cancellation of removal, deportability and admissibility, judicial review, the right to counsel.
- H.R. 4966. *Restoration of Fairness in Immigration Law Act of 2000* - To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to restore fairness to immigration law regarding due process, judicial review, removal proceedings, and detention.
- H.R. 5062 - to establish the eligibility of certain aliens lawfully admitted for permanent residence for cancellation of removal under section 240A of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

(IMMIGRATION) Reorganization/Improvement of the Immigration Service

- S. 2586. *Immigration Services and Infrastructure Improvements Act of 2000* - A bill to reduce the backlog in the processing of immigration benefit applications and to make improvements to infrastructure necessary for the effective provision of immigration services, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 4798. *Immigration Services and Infrastructure Improvements Act of 2000* - A bill to reduce the backlog in the processing of immigration benefit applications and to make improvements to infrastructure necessary for the effective provision of immigration services, and for other purposes.

(IMMIGRATION) Relief from Deportation for Central American and Other Immigrants

- H. R. 1841 - To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to restore eligibility for adjustment of status under section 245 (i) of that Act.
- H.R. 2722. *Central American and Haitian Adjustment Act of 1999* - A bill to amend the Nicaraguan Adjustment and Central American Relief Act to provide to certain nationals of El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Haiti an opportunity to apply for adjustment of status under that Act, and for other purposes.
- S. 2668. *Family Work and Immigrant Integration Amendments of 2000* - A bill to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to improve procedures for the adjustment of status of aliens, to reduce the backlog of family-sponsored aliens, and for other purposes.
- S. 2058 - A bill to extend filing deadlines for applications for adjustment of status of certain Cuban, Nicaraguan, and Haitian nationals.
- S. 2912. *Latino and Immigrant Fairness Act* - A bill to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to remove certain limitations on the eligibility of aliens residing in the United States to obtain lawful permanent residency status.
- H.R.5548. *Departments of Commerce, Justice, and State, the Judiciary, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, Title XI, Legal Immigration Family Equity Act of 2000* - A bill to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to allow eligible aliens residing in and outside the United States to obtain temporary status and/or lawful permanent resident status.
- H. R. 5666. Making miscellaneous appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2001, and for other purposes, Title XV, *LIFE Act Amendments* - to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to allow eligible aliens residing in and outside the United States to obtain temporary status and/or lawful permanent resident status.

(IMMIGRATION) Increase in Visas for Skilled Temporary Workers

- S. 2045, *American Competitiveness in the Twenty-first Century Act of 2000* - Amends the Immigration and Nationality Act to increase available nonimmigrant H-1B specialty occupation visas for FY 2001 through 2003.

(NATURALIZATION) Accomodation for Immigrants with Disabilities

- S. 2812 - to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide a waiver of the oath of renunciation and allegiance for naturalization of aliens having certain disabilities.

- S. 1227. *Immigrant Children's Health Improvement Act of 1999* - Amends the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 with respect to lawful resident aliens and their eligibility for Medicaid (title XIX of the Social Security Act (SSA)) and other types of Federal assistance.
- H.R. 1399. *Fairness for Legal Immigrants Act of 1999* - Amends the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 with respect to lawful resident aliens and their eligibility for Medicaid and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) (titles XIX and XVI of the Social Security Act (SSA)) and other Federal assistance.
- H.R. 4707. *Immigrant Children's Health Improvements Act of 2000* - to amend titles XIX and XXI of the Social Security Act to permit States the option of coverage of legal immigrants under the Medicaid Program and the State children's health insurance program.
