
Enclosed is an amended semi-annual lobbying report covering the first six months of 2001 for Enron Corp. ("Enron"). As counsel to Enron, we are advised that the amended report reflects a good faith effort to disclose the lobbying activities undertaken during the reporting period. We understand that Enron exercised great diligence in preparing this amendment in an effort to accurately revise the information contained in the initial filing. However, there is no current employee who has personal knowledge of much of the activity disclosed and no one is in a position to sign the report on behalf of Enron. Unfortunately, virtually all the Enron employees who worked in the Washington, D.C. office are no longer with the company. Moreover, those employees who are still with the company are exposed for actions taken on behalf of Enron without indemnity or director and officer liability coverage.
