Medicare; Medicare Inpatient PPS proposed rule; advocated to support a delay of CMS' proposal to implement in FY07 new Diagnosis-Related Group (DRG) weights for one year; Advocated for an extension of the reclassifications made under Section 508 of the Medicare Modernization Act (MMA); Advocated for CMS to make permanent its policy for computing and applying an imputed rural wage index floor for each all-urban States; Advocated to maintain the threshold used to determine whether a hospital unit qualifies as an inpatient rehabilitation facility under Medicare; Advocated to increase physician payments under Medicare or at minimum provide doctors with a positive Medicare payment in 2007; Advocated to reauthorize the Children's Hospitals Graduate Medical Education Program through 2011 (GME); Advocated for H.R. 6132, the Securing Effective and Necessary Individual Outpatient Rehabilitation Services Act to extend the Medicare exceptions process for therapy services; Advocated for support of H.R. 6408, the Health/Tax Extender Bill that included a provision to reverse a 5.1% reduction in Medicare physician reimbursements scheduled to take effect in January 2007 and a six month extension of Section 508 of the MMA bill of 2003. Medicaid. Opposed CMS' efforts to reduce Medicaid spending by \$12.2 billion over five years administratively. Medicare and Medicaid (see addendum)
