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## Response to #16

H.R. 2071 (Export Freedom to Cuba Act): To allow travel between the United States and Cuba

S. 950 (Freedom to Travel to Cuba Act of 2003): To allow travel between the United States and Cuba

H.R. 3422: To provide the people of Cuba with access to food and medicines from the United States, to ease restrictions on travel to Cuba, to provide scholarships for certain Cuban nationals, and for other purposes

H.AMDT.375 to H. R. 2989 (Transportation, Treasury, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act, 2004): Amendment prohibits any funds in the bill from being used to enforce regulations that restrict United States citizens from traveling to Cuba.

H.AMDT.377 to H.R.2989 (Transportation, Treasury, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act, 2004): Amendment prohibits any funds in the bill from being used to enforce restrictions on remittances made to Cuban nationals or Cuban households.

H.AMDT.382 to H.R.2989 (Transportation, Treasury, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act, 2004): Amendment prohibits funds in the bill from being used to implement a regulation which would end licenses for travel to Cuba for educational purposes unless the travel consisted exclusively of students taking formal case work.

S.AMDT.1900 to H.R.2989 (Transportation, Treasury, and Independent Agencies Appropriations Act, 2004): To prohibit the enforcement of the ban on travel to Cuba
