The Fairness Act

The Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA)

· Worked with Congress to introduce the Fairness Act, legislation designed to respond to a succession of Supreme Court opinions.

· Worked in coalition with other groups to support the introduction of ENDA, which would prohibit employers using an individual's sexual orientation as the basis for employment decisions.

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
