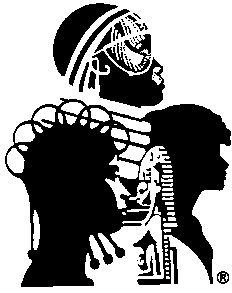

This communication was sent to a former employee, Sheila Clark, who left the organization in April 2001.

Please be advised that the Black Women's Health Imperative does not lobby as defined by the Internal Revenue Service. The Black Women's Health Imperative serves as the only national not-for-profit 501(c)(3) educational, scientific, advocacy and leadership development organization working to ensure optimum health for Black women across their life span – physically, mentally and spiritually.

This organization has not filed a lobbying report since my tenure began in March 2001. As such, I am requesting that the Black Women's Health Imperative's name be removed from this list and that the organization be terminated from this process.
