Line 16. Addendum A

- S 313 To repeal the PUHCA of 1935, to enact the Public Utility Holding Act of 1999, all provisions relating repeal of PUHCA of 1935, and enacting PUHCA of 1999.
- S. 516 To benefit consumers by promoting competition in the electricity power industry, all provisions relating to the electric utility deregulation.
- HR 667 To remove Federal impediments to retail competition in the electric power industry, thereby providing opportunities within electricity restructuring, all provisions relating to electric utility deregulation.
- HR 1587 To establish competitive retail markets for electricity, to clarify the roles of the Federal Government and the States in retail electricity markets, to remove certain Federal barriers to competition, all provisions relating to the electric utility deregulation.
- HR 1828 To provide for a more competitive electric power industry, all provisions relating to the electric utility deregulation.
Also companion bills S. 1047 and S. 1048.
- HR 2363 To repeal the PUHCA of 1935, to enact the PUHCA of 1999, all provisions.
- HR 2645 To provide for the restructuring of the electric power industry
