**16. Specific lobbying issues**

1. **Support** The Religious Land Use and Institutionalized Persons Act, which prevents government interference with free exercise of religion for house of worship as well as people in prison and other institutions.
2. **Support** The President's Administration proposed contractor responsibility regulations and to oppose any effort to block implementation of the regulations through an appropriations rider or other measure.
3. **Support** President Clinton's Nomination of Attorney Dolly Gee to the Federal District Court for the Central District of California.
4. LCCR urged congress to consider the impact of H.R. 3703 on the Government Sponsored Enterprises (GSE) ability to make home ownership and rental housing more affordable. We also believe that many of the provisions in the proposed bill would be harmful to the goal of providing decent and affordable housing for all Americans.
5. **Support** improvement to H.R.2 and S.2 designed to promote stability in the schooling of homeless children, greater awareness of the rights of homeless children and elimination of gaps in their schooling.
6. **Support** FY 2000 increase for the Civil Rights Enforcement budget for all federal agencies.
7. **Oppose** H.R. 4548, the Agricultural Opportunities Act would create an enormous new foreign Agricultural guestworker program which would undercut the poor conditions of nation's farmworkers.
8. **Support** for the Hate Crimes Prevention Act, named "Local Law Enforcement Enhancement Act", which would expand existing federal hate crimes laws.
9. **Support** full funding for Home Internet Access (HIA) program.

10. LCCR strongly *supported* swift passage of H.R. 5062; which eliminated the retroactive application of several harsh changes made to deportation laws in 1996
11. *Opposed* S.2068, Radio Broadcasting Preservation Act of 2000, and any other effort to limit the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) decision to give local community organizations the opportunity to enhance diversity in local radio broadcasting through their low power FM radio (LPFM) initiative.
