Because of the moving of our headquarters along with our files, in the fall of 2002, our records prior to the move are not all perfect. We had believed we had been filing reports regularly; however, we were unable to discover the year-end 2001 report in our records. Upon interviewing various individuals who were involved, we believe that the illness of an administrative employee who reportedly played a key role in getting the reports out may have been responsible for the failure to file, but we cannot be certain because that employee is since deceased.

Please be assured that we take our reporting obligations to the House and Senate on lobbying matters seriously; we have and will continue to expend serious resources in meeting these obligations.


