S. 852 – The Fair Asbestos Injury Resolution Act – A bill to provide compensation to victims of asbestos exposure, by establishing a national trust fund financed by entities with asbestos liability. Interested in all provisions, including establishment of fund, funding levels, compensation levels, eligibility requirements, and compensation awards.

S. 1033 and H.R. 2230 – Secure America and Orderly Immigration Act – Identical bills to improve border security and immigration. Interested in temporary worker provisions, worker protection provisions, and independent worker visas.

S. 1307/H.R. 3045 - Central American Free Trade Act – A bill to implement the Dominican Republic-Central America-United States Free Trade Agreement. Interested in prevailing wage provisions and impact of Agreement on project labor agreements.

H.R. 3 – Transportation Equity Act – A bill to authorize funds for Federal-aid highways, highway safety program and transit programs, and for other purposes. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

H.R. 1816 – Truth in Employment Act – A bill to amend the National Labor Relations Act to protect employer rights. Interested in protecting employee and union rights.

S. 1042 – National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2006. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon proposed amendment applicable to Hanscom AFB.

H.R. 6 – Energy Policy Act of 2005 – A bill designed to ensure jobs for our future with secure, affordable, and reliable energy. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

H.R. 4560 – Clean Water Trust Act of 2005 – A bill to amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to authorize appropriations for State water pollution control revolving funds, and for other purposes. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

H.R. 1780 – Clean Water Investment and Infrastructure Security Act of 2005 – A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide that the volume cap for private activity bonds shall not apply to bonds for facilities for the furnishing of water and sewage facilities. Interested in Davis-Bacon implications.

S. 1314 – Clean Water Infrastructure Financing Act of 2005 – A bill to amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to authorize appropriations for States water pollution control revolving funds, and for other purposes. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

S. 895 – Rural Water Supply Act of 2005 – A bill to direct the Secretary of the Interior to establish a rural water supply program in the Reclamation States to provide a clean, safe, affordable, and reliable water supply to residents. Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

S. 1438 – Comprehensive Enforcement and Immigration Reform Act of 2005 – Amends the Immigration and Nationality Act, and sets forth other immigration-related provisions with respect to increases in funding, personnel and technology at the federal, state, and local level for border enforcement and visa security, workplace enforcement, document integrity, immigration fraud, and detention and removal of illegal aliens. Interested in temporary worker provisions, worker protection provisions, and independent worker visas.

S. 1400 – Water Infrastructure Financing Act of 2005 – Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to projects financed under the Act.

S. 1786 – A Bill to Authorize Emergency Grants-in-Aid for Repair of Airports Damaged by Hurricane Katrina – Interested in application of Davis-Bacon to disaster relief work financed by the Act.

H.R. 3673 – Supplemental Hurricane Katrina Disaster Relief Bill – Interested in application of Davis-Bacon to disaster relief work financed by the Act.

H.J. RES. 69 – Joint Resolution declaring that the national emergency declared by the finding of the President September 8, 2005, in Proclamation 7924 is hereby terminated. Interested in all aspects of resolution.

H.R. 4100 – The Louisiana Recovery Act – Interested in application of Davis-Bacon Act to work financed by the Act.

H.R. 2360 – Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2006 – Making appropriations for the Department of Homeland Security for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2006, and for other purposes. S. 1932 - Budget Reconciliation Act – An original bill to provide for reconciliation pursuant to section 202(a) of the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2006 (H. Con. Res. 95). Interested in provisions to authorize drilling in ANWAR.

S. 1916 – Strengthening America's Security Act of 2005 – A bill to strengthen national security and United States borders, and for other purposes. Interested in worker protection provisions.
