Specific lobbying issues S. 1447/PL 107-71 (Holling, D-SC), the "Aviation and Transportation Security Act," amends the Department of Transportation, establishes a Deputy Secretary for Transportation Security who shall be responsible for security for all modes of transportation, makes the Attorney General responsible for Federal security screening operations for passenger air transportation and property, expands the Federal Air Marshal program, authorizes the Secretary of Transportation, with the agreement of the Attorney General or head of a Federal law enforcement agency, to order the deployment of Federal law enforcement personnel at secure areas of an airport to counter the risk of criminal violence, the risk of aircraft piracy and to air carrier aircraft operations at such airport, or to meet national security concerns, directs the Secretary to carry out a program to permit qualified law enforcement officers, firefighters, and emergency medical technicians to provide emergency services on commercial air flights during emergencies and protects them from liability, if the individual meets certain qualifications to be established;




