



H.R. 94, the "Fallen Law Enforcement Officers and Firefighters Flag Memorial Act," would provide the families of law enforcement officers and firefighters killed in the line of duty with a flag that has been flown over the U.S. Capitol;

H.R. 104, the "Law Enforcement Officers Flag Memorial Act," would provide the families of deceased law enforcement officers with a flag that has been flown over the U.S. Capitol;

H.R. 253, the "Traffic Stops Along the Border Statistics Study Act," would require the U.S. Attorney General to collect race and other data on traffic stops made by State and local law enforcement officers;

H.R. 314/S. 103, the "Combat Meth Act," would provide additional funds to train State and local law enforcement in the investigation of methamphetamine offenses, expand the Methamphetamine/Drug Hot Spots program to include personnel and equipment for enforcement, prosecution, and lab clean-up, establish grant programs for drug-endangered children, and limit access to pseudoephedrine, the primary ingredient in methamphetamine production;

H.R. 798, the "Methamphetamine Remediation Research Act of 2005," legislation to establish a research program to develop voluntary guidelines for the remediation of former methamphetamine labs, enhance the research on the residual effects of meth labs on first responders and others, and support research into new methamphetamine detection technologies and the development of field test kits;

H.R. 970/S. 155, the "Gang Prevention and Effective Deterrence Act," is a comprehensive, national approach to the problem of gang violence which would provide Federal funding to support joint Federal, State and local law enforcement efforts to combat violent gangs and amend the Federal criminal code to define new offenses which will enable law enforcement to fight gangs and gang-related activity more effectively;

H.R. 972/PL 109-164, the "Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act," which extends the sexually violent offender registration program to foreign offenses, enhances efforts to combat human trafficking and authorizes the U.S. Attorney General to make grants to States and local law enforcement agencies for programs to investigate and prosecute domestic trafficking in persons;

H.R. 1122/S. 564, the "Safe Intersections Act of 2005," would criminalize the unauthorized sale or use of traffic signal preemption devices;

H.R. 1279, the "Gang Deterrence and Community Protection Act," aims to reduce criminal gang activity by providing for increased assistance in certain designated "high intensity interstate gang activity areas" to build multijurisdictional efforts targeting criminal street gangs using Federal funds;

H.R. 1528, the "Defending America's Most Vulnerable: Safe Access to Drug Treatment and Child Protection Act" would increase the mandatory minimum sentences for drug distribution to persons under 21 years of age and persons who maintain drug-involved premises affecting children, and also provide for life imprisonment for felons and violent criminals convicted a third time for such an offense;

H.R. 1710, the "Internet Police Protection Act," would create a new Federal criminal offense prohibiting persons from making available on the Internet restricted personal information concerning judges, law enforcement and other public safety officers, jurors, witnesses or other officers in any United States Court;

H.R. 2363, the "Peace Officer Justice Act," would make the murder of a law enforcement officer and subsequent flight to a foreign nation a Federal crime punishable by death or life imprisonment;

H.R. 1751, the "Secure Access to Justice and Court Protection Act," which would increase the penalties for threats and violence against law enforcement officers, judges, and courtroom personnel, including the application of the death penalty, and also impose time limits and substantive limits on Federal courts' review of habeas corpus petitions challenging a State court conviction for killing a law enforcement officer, judge, or other public safety officer;

H.R. 1758, the "Open Air Drug Market Penalty Act," would amend the Controlled Substances Act to provide additional five years imprisonment for knowingly committing a Federal drug offense within 500 feet of the place where any similar offense was committed in the preceding 48 hours;

H.R. 2942, the "Sexual Predator Sentencing Act," would raise the mandatory minimum sentences for first-time offenders and increase the penalty for criminals convicted of a second sexual offense to life;

H.R. 2965, "Federal Prison Industries Competition in Contracting Act of 2005," which would restrict Federal agencies from contracting from the Federal Prison Industries (FPI);

H.R. 3020/S. 1368, the "United States Parole Commission Extension and Sentencing Commission Authority Act," which would extend the authority of the U.S. Parole Commission for an additional three (3) years;

H.R. 3057/PL 109-102, the "Foreign Operations, Export Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 2006," provides funding for the U.S. Department of State and for foreign operations, and a provision that would withhold foreign aid from any nation which refuses to honor its extradition treaty with the United States;

H.R. 3199/S. 1389, the "USA PATRIOT and Terrorism Prevention Reauthorization Act," would reauthorize expiring provisions of the USA PATRIOT Act;

H.R. 3889, the "Methamphetamine Epidemic Elimination Act," which would increase the criminal penalties for trafficking, possession, and production of methamphetamines, enable the U.S. Attorney General to establish domestic production and import quotas for precursor chemicals, reduce the per-transaction sales limit on methamphetamine precursors, and provide resources to law enforcement to help prevent the smuggling of methamphetamines into the U.S. through Mexico;

H.R. 4411, the "Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act," which would require financial transaction providers to block and refuse transactions associated with illegal gambling and direct the Secretary of the Treasury to issue guidelines for financial transaction providers that would identify and prevent these restricted transactions and prevent them;

H.R. 4709, the "Law Enforcement and Phone Privacy Protection Act," would prohibit the sale or transfer of records without consumer authorization and impose an additional penalty if the sale or transfer is used in a case of domestic violence or against a law enforcement officer or his family;

H. Con. Res. 85, a resolution expressing the sense of Congress that a postage stamp should be issued to honor law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty;

S. 122, the "Federal Death Penalty Abolition Act," would abolish the death penalty option for all Federal crimes which currently carry that penalty;

S. 344, legislation to link together the offenses and sentencing enhancements under Federal law for criminal sale of drugs to individuals under the age of 21, who sell or manufacture drugs in or near schools and colleges, and who employ children under 18 years of age in drug operations;
