16. Specific lobbying issues

1. **Oppose** the Nomination of Brian Jones, General Counsel at the Department of Education.
2. **Support** the "End Racial Profiling Act of 2001" (S.989/H.R. 1343) which would ban the use of racial profiling, provide funding for studies and establish a system of accountability for officers using the practice.
3. **Oppose** Nomination of Gerald Reynolds, for Assistant Secretary of Civil Rights, Department of Education.
4. **Support** S.1311, "Refugee Protection Act of 2001", a bill to limit the use of expedited removal proceeding and immigration detection on refugees who are fleeing persecution to torture.
5. **Support** full funding for the Department of Education's Community Technology Program per the Senate request under the House and Senate Labor, Health Human Service, FY2002 Appropriations.
6. **Support** H.R. 2292, "Civil Rights Protection Act of 2001" which would restore the right of workers to sue an employer in federal and state court for violations of anti-discrimination laws in cases involving binding arbitration agreements.
7. **Oppose** S.1442, Wage Equity Act of 2001, it would reduce wages of agricultural guestworkers from below poverty to an even lower level.
8. **Oppose** H.R. 2975, USA-Patriot Act of 2001, the lack of a sunset clause in provisions that may unduly harm the rights of immigrants.
9. **Support** (S. 1452), "Family Reunification Act of 2001". A bill to permit certain long-term permanent resident aliens to seek cancellation of removal.



Continue lobbying issues

10. LCCR strongly **supported** H.R. 87, "Keeping Families Together Act of 2000." A bill to restore certain provisions relating to the definition of aggravated felony and other provisions of immigration law to their status before the enactment of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996.
11. **Support** S.955, "Immigrant Fairness Restoration Act of 2001", to modify immigration law restrictions added by the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996.
12. **Oppose** H.R. 2457, Wage Equity Act of 2001, it would reduce wages of agricultural guestworkers from below poverty to an even lower level.
13. **Support** the "Equal Protection of Voting Rights of 2001" (S.565/H.R. 1170), an electoral reform bill that would address many of the problems exposed during the past election by improving education and accessibility.
14. **Oppose** Section 141 of H.R. 3129, "The Customs Border Security Act of 2001" section 141 would give the U.S. Customs agents immunity from civil lawsuits if they are acting in good faith when conducting a search.
