Dual Taxation. This firm met with various congressional members and staff about seeking proposed legislation addressing the problem of dual taxation on Indian lands.

H.R. 2992. A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act to protect Indian tribes from coerced labor agreements.

S. 985. A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act.

S. 399 A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act.

S. 339. A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act.

H.R. 1188. A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act to provide adequate and certain remedies for sovereign tribal governments.

H.R. 2466. Amendments to the FY 2000 appropriations bill prohibiting the Secretary from promulgating procedures to regulate gaming when a state refuses to compact.

Land-into-Trust. This firm contacted various members of the Senate and House, and also provided testimony, requesting opposition to congressional preemption of ongoing efforts of the Department of the Interior to develop new regulations to guide it in determining whether to take land into trust on behalf of Indian tribes and individual Indians.
