Of interest to the TILMC are proposals by some Members of Congress, backed by the Clinton Administration, to cover a portion of the \$168 billion drug benefit plan over the fiscal 2002-09 period, with a 55-cent cigarette tax increase. In addition to this tax, TILMC also is concerned about related efforts to speed up the effective date of federal cigarette tax increases, already scheduled to go into effect January 1, 2000, and again in January 2002.

S. 1480, the Senate SPICE companion bill. TILMC concerns with this bill by Senators Snowe (R-ME) and Wyden (D-OR) are similar to those in H.R. 2782.

H.R. 1875, a bill to allow many class action lawsuit cases to be transferred to federal courts. Of interest to the TILMC was an amendment by Rep. Jackson Lee (D-TX) to exempt tobacco lawsuits. The amendment failed on September 23, 1999, by a vote of 162-266.

H.R. 2782, the House version of the SPICE act to cover the costs of prescription drugs. Of interest to the TILMC are proposals by some Members of Congress, backed by the Clinton Administration, to cover a portion of the \$168 billion drug benefit plan over the fiscal 2002-09 period, with a 55-cent cigarette tax increase. In addition to this tax, TILMC also is concerned about related efforts to speed up the effective date of federal cigarette tax increases, already scheduled to go into effect January 1, 2000, and again in January 2002.

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
