H.R. 1375, Financial Services Regulatory Relief Act of 2003 - would modify and/or eliminate a number of outdated laws that govern the financial services industry (banks, thrifts and credit unions) and would establish clearer guidelines for the federal agencies regulating the industry.

H.R. 2622, Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act-would reauthorize 7 expiring preemptions of the Fair Credit Reporting Act that establish uniform national standards for certain consumer credit, insurance and employment transactions, and would impose new requirements on banks and credit bureaus designed to stem identity theft.

S.660, Economic Opportunity Protection Act of 2003-would extend limitations on certain provisions of state law under the Fair Credit Reporting Act.

H.R. 1766, National Uniform Privacy Standards Act of 2003-would make the expiring provisions of the Fair Credit Reporting Act permanent and would amend the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act to make it the national uniform privacy standard for financial institutions.
H.R. 2035, Identity Theft and Financial Privacy Protection Act of 2003-would address the rising crime of identity theft that is mostly associated with the fraudulent acquisition of credit cards and other financial products.

S.877, Controlling the Assault of Non-Solicited Pornography and Marketing Act (CAN-SPAM)-would outlaw false and deceptive subject lines in unsolicited emails and require legitimate return addresses, as well as opt-out alternatives for future mailings.

S.1231, Stop Ornography and Abusive Marketing Act (SPAM Act)- would create a national No-Spam registry and allow individuals to sue spammers.

H.R. 2214, Reduction in Distribution of Spam Act of 2003-would allow consumers to opt-out of receiving future spam messages and would make false and deceptive email illegal.
H.R. 2515, Anti-Spam Act of 2003-would require labeling of email content and outlaw deceptive subject lines, as well as require valid return email addresses and street addresses.

H.R. 1933, Restrict and Eliminate the Delivery of Unsolicited Commercial Electronic Mail Act of 2003 (REDUCE Spam Act of 2003)-would outlaw false and deceptive subject lines, require valid return email addresses and street addresses.

H.R. 1933, Restrict and Eliminate the Delivery of Unsolicited Commercial Electronic Mail Act of 2003 (REDUCE Spam Act of 2003)-would outlaw false and deceptive subject lines, require labeling emails for advertising and adult advertising, require legitimate return addresses and the opt-out alternative.

S.233, Identity Theft Prevention Act-would require credit card issuers to confirm changes of address and consumer reporting agencies to place a fraud alert in the file upon request by a consumer.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) established a Do-Not-Call registry allowing consumers to register their phone numbers for removal from telemarketing calling lists. The Federal Communications Commission adopted the FTC's registry and also requires businesses to maintain company specific lists.

Improving the efficiency of the current insurance regulatory system, whether by modifying the existing state system or creating an optional federal charter for insurance companies.

H.R. 253, Two Floods and You Are Out of the Taxpayers' Pocket Act of 2003-provisions concerning jurisdiction over suits related to the federal flood insurance program.

Public Law no.107-297 (Terrorism Risk Insurance Act of 2002)-implementation of the Act's requirements.

S.317, Family Time and Workplace Flexibility Act-would amend the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) to provide private-sector employees with a choice between compensatory time off instead of overtime payments.

H.R. 1119, Family time Flexibility Act-would amend the Fair Labor Standards Act to provide an optional program of compensatory time-off (comp-time) in lieu of overtime payments for employees (except employees of public agencies).

Department of Labor proposed rule to amend regulations that implement the overtime pay requirements of FLSA.

H.R. 2096 and S.1335, Long-Term Care and Retirement security Act of 2003-would provide a \$3,000 tax credit to individuals with long-term care needs or their caregivers, and an above-the-line federal income tax deduction for the premiums individuals pay to purchase long-term care insurance.

Public Law No. 108-27 (Jobs and Growth Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2003)-provisions concerning net operating loss carrybacks.

H.R. 1115 and S.274, Class Action Fairness Act of 2003-would allow class action suits involving at least 100 plaintiffs to be removed from state courts and sent to federal courts when at least \$5 million is at stake, and when fewer than one-third of the plaintiffs are from the defendants home state.

S.1125, Fairness in Asbestos Injury Resolution Act of 2003-would establish a trust fund, financed from contributions made by defendant companies and insurers, to pay no-fault claims arising from physical injuries linked to asbestos.
