A bill to authorize the integration and consolidation of alcohol and substance abuse programs and services provided by Indian tribal governments, and for other purposes.

S. 211

A bill to amend the Education Amendments of 1978 and the Tribally Controlled School Act of 1988 to improve education for Indians, Native Hawaiians, and Alaskan Natives.

S. 228

A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to make permanent the Native American veterans housing loan program, and for other purposes.

S. 343

A bill to establish a demonstration project to authorize the integration and coordination of Federal funding dedicated to the community, business, and economic development of Native American communities.

S. 504/H.R. 1175

A bill for administrative procedures to extend Federal recognition to certain Indian groups, and for other purposes.

S. 558

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide tax credits for investment in Indian reservation economic development, and for other purposes.

S. 655

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to exempt from income taxation income derived from natural resources-related activity by a member of an Indian tribe directly through a qualified Indian entity.

S. 660/H.R. 178

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide for the issuance of tax-exempt bonds by Indian tribal governments, and for other purposes.

S. 709

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to clarify the tax treatment of Alaska Native Settlement Trusts.

S. 761

A bill to provide loans for the improvement of telecommunications services on Indian reservations.

S. 832

A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act, and for other purposes.

S. 975

A bill to improve environmental policy by providing assistance for State and tribal land use planning, to promote improved quality of life, regionalism, and sustainable economic development, and for other purposes.

S. 1106

A bill to provide a tax credit for the production of oil or gas from deposits held in trust for, or held with restrictions against alienation by, Indian tribes and Indian individuals.

S. 1186

A bill to provide a budgetary mechanism to ensure that funds will be available to satisfy the Federal Government's responsibilities with respect to negotiated settlements of disputes related to Indian water rights claims and Indian land claims.

S. 1210

A bill to reauthorize the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act of 1996.

S. 1340

A bill to amend the Indian Land Consolidation Act to provide for probate reform with respect to trust or restricted lands.

S. 1344

A bill to provide training and technical assistance to Native Americans who are interested in commercial vehicle driving careers.

S. 1392

A bill to establish procedures for the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Department of the Interior with respect to tribal recognition.

S. 1393

A bill to provide grants to ensure full and fair participation in certain decisionmaking processes at the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

S. 1753

A bill to amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to include medical assistance furnished through an urban Indian health program operated by an urban Indian organization pursuant to a grant or contract with the Indian Health Service under title V of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act in the 100 percent Federal medical assistance percentage applicable to Indian Health Service.

S. 2017/ H.R. 3407

A bill to improve the effectiveness of the Indian loan guarantee and insurance program.

S. 2335

A bill to establish the Office of Native American Affairs within the Small Business Administration and creates the Native American Small Business Development Program.

S. 2484

A bill to amend part A of title IV of the Social Security Act to reauthorize and improve the operation of temporary assistance to needy families programs operated by Indian tribes, and for other purposes.

S. 2711

A bill to reauthorize and improve programs relating to Native Americans.

H.R. 103

A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act to protect Indian tribes from coercive labor agreements.

H.R. 177

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide tax credits for Indian investment and employment, and for other purposes.

H.R. 224

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to permanently extend the Indian employment credit and the depreciation rules for property used predominantly within an Indian reservation.

H.R. 992

A bill to provide grants to local governments to assist such local governments in participating in certain decisions related to certain Indian groups and Indian tribes.

H.R. 1164

A bill to amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to dedicate certain funds for the purpose of reducing violence and hate crime against Native Americans and reducing incidents of crime on reservations, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1635

A bill to provide that the first \$5,000 received from the income of an Indian tribe by a member of the tribe who has attained 50 years of age shall be disregarded in determining the eligibility of the member or the member's household for benefits, and the amount or kind of a benefits of the member or household, under various means-tested public assistance programs.

H.R. 1692

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to simplify and make more equitable the tax treatment of Settlement Trusts established pursuant to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act.

H.R. 1873

A bill to reauthorize the funding for the Native American Housing and Self-Determination Act of 1996.

H.R. 1929

A bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to extend the Native American veteran housing loan pilot program, and for other purposes.

H.R. 2244

A bill to amend the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act to require State legislature approve new gambling facilities, to provide for minimum requirements for Federal regulation of Indian gaming, to set up a commission to report to Congress on current living and health standards in Indian country, and for other purposes.

H.R. 2359

A bill to amend part E of title IV of the Social Security Act to provide equitable access for foster care and adoption services for Indian children in tribal areas.

H.R. 2412

A bill to establish programs to improve energy development on Indian lands, and for other purposes.

H.R. 2538

A bill to amend the Small Business Act to expand and improve the assistance provided Small Business Development Centers to Indian tribe members, Native Alaskans, and Native Hawaiians.

H.R. 3548

A bill to provide for uniform recognition of Indian tribes by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and for other purposes.

H.R. 3761

A bill to establish a program to provide assistance to institutions of higher education serving members of Indian tribes.

H.R. 3851

A bill to encourage the negotiated settlement of tribal claims

H.R. 3931

A bill to provide for the establishment of the Lands Title Report Commission for Indian trust lands.

H.R. 4719

A bill to ensure that any business owned and operated by an Indian tribe and located on Indian lands is not considered an employer for purposes of the National Labor Relations Act.

H.R. 4734

A bill to expand Alaska Native contracting of Federal land management functions and activities and promotes hiring of Alaska Natives by the Federal Government within the State of Alaska

H.R. 4887

A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to treat Indian tribes the same as states and governments for the purposes of chapter 35 of the Code.
