H.R. 4661, H.R. 29, H.R. 744 and S. 687 are Internet spyware bills that would prohibit the unauthorized access to a computer which would cause a program to be added to monitor an individual's Internet activities.

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) delayed adopting new rules regarding business-related fax until June 30, 2005. The Junk Fax Prevention Act of 2005, Public Law 109-21, was enacted June 28, 2005 and sent to the President on June 30, 2005.

Federal Trade Commission's (FTC) proposed rules to implement Public Law 108-159, Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act, that establishes uniform national standards for certain consumer credit insurance and employment transactions.

R-411006 - would require companies to provide a consumer with notice and an opportunity to opt-out before consumer reports are shared with an affiliate for marketing purposes. Met with the FTC to discuss definition.

FTC and Federal Reserve Board's (Fed) proposed interim and final rulemaking to implement Public Law 108-159, Fair and Accurate Credit Transaction Act, that establishes uniform national standards for certain consumer credit insurance and employment transactions.

P044804 and R-1203 require the FTC and Fed to conduct a study on the effects of credit scores and credit based insurance scores on the availability and affordability of financial products.

Office of Thrift Supervision's proposed rules to implement Public Law 108-159, Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act, that establishes uniform national standards for certain consumer credit insurance and employment transactions.

Docket No. 2004-31 would require companies to provide a consumer with notice and an opportunity to opt-out before consumers' reports are shared with an affiliate for marketing purposes. Met with OTS to discuss definition.

Several bills have been introduced in the House and Senate that would impose notice requirements on entities when an individual's sensitive information has been subjected to a security breach.

IRS Revenue Rulings 2004-75 and 2004-97 governing tax withholding on payments made to foreign policyholders of branches of U.S. based life insurance companies.

H.R. 2830, Pension Protection Act - would reform outdated worker pension laws to protect the interests of workers, retirees and taxpayers. House Education and Workforce Subcommittee approved bill on June 22,

H.R. 1163 and S. 545, Lifetime Savings Account Act of 2005 - would allow an individual to create a trust and contributions up to \$5,000 would be tax exempt.

H.R. 1162 and S. 546, Retirement Savings Account Act - would allow an individual to contribute to an account and convert an individual retirement account with special tax treatment.

H.R. 1161 and S. 547, Employer Retirement Savings Accounts Act - would create an arrangement whereby an employee could elect to have an employer make contributions with special tax treatment.
