

12	Specific Lobbying Issues	Increased reimbursement under Medicaid and Medicare for SNFs and home health care, including issues related to the Boren Amendment, creation of an outlier for SNF reimbursement and Intergovernmental Transfer issues. Regulatory relief for these entities including single task worker legislation, reforms of the survey and certification process including enforcement issues, occupational safety and health issues, and visa legislation for semi-skilled workers as well as Labor-IHHS-Education appropriations involving the aforementioned issue areas. Any federal regulatory actions affected assisted living facilities. "Return to home" legislation. Housing authorization and appropriations issues including elderly housing and assisted living issues, and preference for non-profit purchasers of housing units no longer in the Section 8 program. Raising of state caps for housing bonds.
