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H.R. 3010/ S. 3708, Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education and Related Agencies Appropriations Act of 2006 - Multiple clauses; Provides funding for the Division of Diabetes Translation (DDT) at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as well as funding for research at the National Institutes of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). We lobby for increased funding for both of these agencies, on behalf of those who will benefit from the research and education/information programs that they provide.

H.Con.Res. 376/S.Com.Res 83, FY2007 Government Budget bill – Multiple clauses; Provides the allocations for overall funding streams for the United States government’s budget for a given federal fiscal year. ADA worked to have the line for health funding increased at this stage.

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H.R. 4157, the Health Information Technology Promotion Act of 2005 – Support bill, with modification; promotes better records and less errors through a national electronic medical records system. ADA is concerned with adding privacy protection and expanding access to health technology to individuals with low literacy.

H.R. 5225, The Diabetes Prevention Access and Care Act of 2006 – Support entire bill: Would expand resources at NIH and CDC to promote research, treatment, and education regarding diabetes in minority populations.

S. 1074, Healthy Lifestyles and Prevention America Act (HELP America) – Support entire bill; Broadly realigns the U.S. healthcare system in order to provide for more prevention of illness instead of late-stage treatment. In particular, it addresses many of the issues surrounding obesity as a national health issue, and obesity is known to be one of the primary precursors to diabetes. We have submitted suggestions and ideas to the staffs of the bill's sponsors that we believe will improve the bill's impact on this problem, and we continue to work with them on further crafting the legislation.

S. 1325, Improved Nutrition and Physical Activity Act (IMPACT) - Support entire bill; Addresses the national obesity problem and specifically targets populations of individuals at-risk for pre-diabetes and diabetes by providing incentives for better nutrition and higher levels of physical activity, particularly among youth. We have provided ideas and assistance on crafting legislation and continue to work with the bill's sponsors to encourage passage.

S. 3917/ H.R. 6147, The Gestational Diabetes Act (GeDi Act) - Support entire bill; Legislation expands screening, diagnosis, data collection and treatment of gestational diabetes and the children born from women with gestational diabetes.

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H.R. 525, the Small Business Health Fairness Act of 2005 – Oppose entire bill; Authorizes the creation of Association Health Plans (AHPs), which –among other exemptions— would be exempt from state health plan mandates requiring coverage and reimbursement for diabetes supplies, education, and equipment.

S. 1955, the Health Insurance Marketplace Modernization and Affordability Act of 2005- Oppose entire bill; Would deregulate the private health insurance industry that is currently regulated by states and pre-empt the state health plan mandates requiring coverage and reimbursement for diabetes supplies, education, and equipment. Additionally, it would alter the way states rate individuals based on age, gender and health status, making difficult for people with diabetes to obtain coverage.

H.R. 2355, the Health Care Choice Act- Oppose entire bill; Allows insurers to domicile in one state and sell individual in policies across state lines into other states, without adherence to state regulations. Plans could domicile in states without plan mandates mandating coverage and reimbursement for diabetes supplies, education and equipment.

H.R. 810/S. 471, Stem Cell Research Enhancement Act of 2005 – Support entire bill; Expands the number of lines of st that can currently be used for federally-funded research efforts. We advocate for the continued expansion of this line of research, under strict ethical guidelines that are also provided as part of the legislation.

H.R. 6164, National Institutes of Health Reform Act of 2006 – Oppose portions of bill; Would Authorize and cap fundin for the NIH during the authorization period and would establish a common fund originally to be funded through contribut from individual Institutes, such as the NIDDK.
