S. 1491 (to provide for the establishment and implementation of a fingerprint processing system to be used whenever a biometric identifier is issued to an alien). S. 1518 (to improve procedures with respect to the admission to, and departure from, the United States of aliens). S. 1265 (to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to require the Attorney General to conduct a study on the removal and adjust the status of certain aliens who were brought to the United States as children).
