H. R. 4206 'Efficient Energy Through Certified Technologies and Electricity Reliability (EFFECTER) Act April 22, 2004 To provide for various energy efficiency programs and tax incentives, and for other purposes. CUNNINGHAM (for himself, Mr. MARKEY, Mr. MATSUI, and Mr. LEWIS of California) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on Education and the Labor Force, and on Small Business, and on Financial Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for such period as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

H. R. 4503 'Energy Policy Act of 2004' June 3, 2004

To enhance energy conservation and research and development, to provide for security and diversity in energy supply for the American people, and for other purposes.

S. 2014 'Electric Reliability Act of 2004' January 21, 2004 To amend the Federal Power Act to establish reliability standards. Ms. CANTWELL (for herself, Mrs. CLINTON, Mr. JEFFORDS, and Mr. FEINGOLD) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

S. 2015 'Electricity Needs Rules and Oversight Now (ENRON) Act' January 21, 2004 To prohibit energy manipulation. Ms. CANTWELL (for herself, Mr.

FEINGOLD, and Mr. JEFFORDS) introduced the following bill; which was read

S. 2236 'Electric Reliability Act of 2004' March 25, 2004 To enhance the reliability of the electric system. CANTWELL (for herself, Mr. BINGAMAN, Mrs. CLINTON, Mr. JEFFORDS, Mr. SCHUMER, Mr. REID, and Mr. DASCHLE) introduced the following bill; which was read the first time.

S. 2311 'Efficient Energy Through Certified Technologies and Electricity Reliability (EFFECTER) Act of 2004' April 8, 2004 To provide for various energy efficiency programs and tax incentives, and for other purposes. SNOWE (for herself, Mrs. FEINSTEIN, Mr. BINGAMAN, and Ms. CANTWELL) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance.

S. 2633 'Electricity Gouging Refund Act of 2003' July 8, 2004 To amend the Federal Power Act to provide for refunds for unjust and unreasonable charges on electric energy in the State of California. Mrs. BOXER introduced the following bill; which was read the first time.

H.R. 6 "Energy Policy Act of 2003" To enhance energy conservation and research and development, to provide for security and energy supply for the American people, and for other purposes.

H.R. 316 To eliminate certain restrictions on the availability of credits under title III of the Energy Policy Act of 1992 for the use and for other purposes.

H.R. 671 "Renewable Energy Production Incentive Reform Act" To reauthorize and revise the Renewable Energy Production and for other purposes.

H.R. 999 "Clear Skies Act of 2003" To amend the Clean Air Act to reduce air pollution through expansion of cap and trade program, alternative regulatory classification for units subject to the cap and trade program, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1013 To amend the Federal Power Act to provide for alternative conditions and alternative fishways in hydroelectric dam licenses and for other purposes.

H.R. 1041 "Distributed Power Hybrid Energy Act" To direct the Secretary of Energy to develop and implement a strategy for development, demonstration, and commercial application of distributed power hybrid energy systems, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1254 "Truth in Electricity Trading Act of 2003" To amend the Federal Power Act to provide for market transparency in electric energy, to prohibit round trip trading of electricity, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1255 "Truth in Electricity Revenue Reporting Act of 2003" To amend the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 to prohibit the recording of revenue from round trip sales of electric power.

H.R. 1294 To amend title VI of the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 to establish a Federal renewable energy portfolio standard for certain retail electric utilities, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1337 To encourage the development of hydroelectric projects, and for other purposes.

H.R. 1338 To amend the Federal Power Act to provide for Federal and State coordination of permitting for electric transmission facilities and for other purposes.

H.R. 1341 "Ratepayer Protection Act" To prospectively repeal section 210 of the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 and for other purposes.

H.R. 1458 "Homeland Infrastructure Power Security and Assurance Incentives Act of 2003" To authorize the Secretary of Energy to establish an Advanced Technology Incentives Program to fund the development and deployment of new advanced technologies such as fuel cell and storage system power technologies.

H.R. 1644 "Energy Policy Act of 2003" To enhance energy conservation and research and development, to provide for security and energy supply for the American people, and for other purposes.
