Ms. CANTWELL (for herself, Mrs. CLINTON, Mr. JEFFORDS, and Mr. FEINGOLD) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

**S. 2015** *'Electricity Needs Rules and Oversight Now (ENRON) Act'* January 21, 2004 To prohibit energy market manipulation. Ms. CANTWELL (for herself, Mr. FEINGOLD, and Mr. JEFFORDS) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

**S. 2236** *'Electric Reliability Act of 2004'* March 25, 2004 To enhance the reliability of the electric system. CANTWELL (for herself, Mr. BINGAMAN, Mrs. CLINTON, Mr. JEFFORDS, Mr. SCHUMER, Mr. REID, and Mr. DASCHLE) introduced the following bill; which was read the first time.

**S. 2311** *'Efficient Energy Through Certified Technologies and Electricity Reliability (EFFECTER) Act of 2004'* April 8, 2004 To provide for various energy efficiency programs and tax incentives, and for other purposes. SNOWE (for herself, Mrs. FEINSTEIN, Mr. BINGAMAN, and Ms. CANTWELL) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance.

**S. 2633** *'Electricity Gouging Refund Act of 2003'* July 8, 2004 To amend the Federal Power Act to provide for unjust and unreasonable charges on electric energy in the State of California. Mrs. BOXER introduced the following bill; which was read the first time.
