- S.1 An original bill to extend programs and activities under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965. **(Issue lobbied: Entire bill.)**
- S.77 A bill to amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to provide more effective remedies to victims of discrimination in the payment of wages on the basis of sex, and for other purposes. **(Issue lobbied: Entire bill.)**
- S.171 A bill to repeal certain travel provisions with respect to Cuba and certain trade sanctions with respect to Cuba, Iran, Libya, North Korea, and Sudan, and for other purposes. **(Issue lobbied: Entire bill.)**
