**Health Care Reform:** Medical Savings Account expansion, tax credits for uninsured, tax equity for self-employed, small business pooling "patients' bill of rights," Medicare reform, prescription drug coverage, other health care issues dealing with small businesses.

**Regulatory Reform:** Paperwork Reduction, regulatory accounting, budget, sound science, ergonomics, CAFE standards, Congressional review issues, and other regulatory issues affecting small businesses.

**Other Issues:** Telecommunications policy (Tauzin-Dingell ). US energy policy, legal reform, global climate treaty and CO2 caps, campaign finance reform, Internet taxation, minimum wage issues, independent contractor rules, antitrust activism, financial service issues, Social Security reform, trade agreements (Trade Promotion Authority, investor fee reduction, OECD tax competitive issues, and ICANN Agreement).
