- 4. Opposed the Federal power grab over regulation of water by expanding the Clean Water Act's definition of "navigable wa of the U.S." to include "all waters of the United States", which would include putting all lakes, streams, tidal puddles and othe such bodies of water under federal jurisdiction.
