Owing to security regulations at the U.S. House of Representatives governing the delivery of items to the Washington, D.C. offices of the U.S. House of Representatives by mail and courier, LDA registrants filing semi-annual reports to the Clerk of the House for the semi-annual period ending December 31, 2002, are advised of the following procedures to ensure timely receipt of filings:

1. Registrants are encouraged to send their original, signed LDA Reports for filing with the Clerk of the House via U.S. Mail. LDA Reports bearing a postmark of a date on or before February 14, 2003, will be considered as received on time and will be disclosed as such.
2. Please do not fax your filing in anticipation of sending the original. The Legislative Resource Center will inform you by e-mail of receipt of your original filing. Please complete the attached e-mail form and include it with your filing.
3. Registrants may also drop off their signed, original LDA Reports to the Clerk's Legislative Resource Center, B-106 Cannon House Office Building, from 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. LDA Reports will not be accepted over the counter from Registrants if they are in sealed envelopes or if left outside the Legislative Resource Center after hours.
4. The U.S. Capitol Police will not allow courier services to deliver to the U.S. House of Representatives. Clerk personnel will not accept deliveries from couriers and will not meet couriers outside the House Office Buildings or the U.S. Capitol to accept items.
5. All parcels sent to the U.S. House of Representatives by next-day delivery services, such as FedEx and UPS, are diverted to House Postal Operations for screening and delivery by House Postal Operations personnel. These items usually take a minimum of 5 - 10 days to reach their intended destination.
