- S. 149 Child Safety Lock Act of 1999. A bill to amend chapter 44 of title 18, U.S. Code, to require the provision of a child safety lock in connection with the transfer of a handgun.
- S. 319 Childproof Handgun Act of 1999. A bill to provide for childproof handguns, and for other purposes.
- S. 637 Internet Gun Trafficking Act of 1999. A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to regulate the transfer of firearms over the Internet, and for other purposes.
- S. 936 Children's Firearm Access Prevention Act. A bill to prevent children from having access to firearms.
- H.R. 218 Community Protection Act of 1999. A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to exempt qualified current and former law enforcement officers from state laws prohibiting the carrying of concealed handguns.
- H.R. 492 A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to provide a national standard in accordance with which non-residents of a state may carry certain concealed firearms in the state, and to exempt qualified current and former law enforcement officers from state laws prohibiting the carrying of concealed handguns.
- H.R. 1428 A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to strengthen the ban against assault weapons by restricting the availability of such weapons and certain of their component parts.

- S. 407 Stop Gun Trafficking Act of 1999. A bill to reduce gun trafficking by prohibiting bulk purchases of handguns.
- S. 443 Gun Show Accountability Act. A bill to regulate the sale of firearms at gun shows.
- S. 457 Permanent Brady Waiting Period of 1999. A bill to amend section 922(t) of title 18, U.S. Code, to require the reporting of information to the chief law enforcement officer of the buyer's residence and to require a minimum 72-hour waiting period before the purchase of a handgun, and for other purposes.
- S. 594 Large Capacity Ammunition Magazine Import Ban of 1999. A bill to ban the importation of large capacity ammunition feeding devices.
- H.R. 902 Gun Show Accountability Act. A bill to regulate the sale of firearms at gun shows.
- H.R. 1032 Firearms Heritage Protection Act of 1999. A bill to prohibit civil liability actions from being brought or continued against manufacturers, distributors, dealers, or importers of firearms or ammunition for damages resulting from the misuse of their products by others.
- H.R. 1037 A bill to ban the importation of large capacity ammunition feeding devices, and to extend the ban on transferring such devices to those that were manufactured before the ban became law.
- H.R. 1062 A bill to amend section 922(t) of title 18, U.S. Code, to require the reporting of information to the chief law enforcement officer of the buyer's residence and to require a minimum 72-hour waiting period before the purchase of a handgun, and for the purposes.
- H.R. 1658 Civil Asset Forfeiture Reform Act. A bill to provide a more just and uniform procedure for federal civil forfeitures, and for other purposes.

- S. 254 Violent and Repeat Juvenile Offender Act. A bill to reduce violent juvenile crime, promote accountability by rehabilitation of juvenile criminals, punish and deter violent gang crime, and for other purposes. (Authorize grants and programs to combat juvenile crime)
- S. 538 Protect Children From Violence Act. A bill to provide for violent and repeat juvenile offender accountability and for other purposes
- S. 891 Juvenile Gun Loophole Closure Act. A bill to amend section 922(x) of title 18, U.S. Code, to prohibit the transfer to and possession of handguns, semi-automatic assault weapons, and large capacity ammunition feeding devices by individuals who are less than 21 years of age, and for other purposes.
- S. 991 Youth Violence Prevention Act of 1999. A bill to prevent the receipt, transfer, transportation, or possession of a firearm or ammunition by certain violent juvenile offenders, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 85 A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to prohibit with certain exceptions, the transfer of a handgun to or the possession of a handgun by an individual who has not attained 21 years of age.
- H.R. 1342 Children's Gun Violence Prevention Act of 1999. A bill to protect children from firearms violence.
- H.R. 2037 A bill to combat youth violence and to protect children from violent crime.
- H.R. 2122 A bill to require background checks at gun shows, and for other purposes.

- S. 25 Conservation and Reinvestment Act of 1999. A bill to provide coastal impact assistance to state and local governments, to amend the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act Amendments of 1978, the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965, the Urban Park and Recreation Recovery Act, and the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act (commonly referred to as the Pitman-Robertson Act) To establish a fund to meet the outdoor conservation and recreation needs of the American people, and for other purposes.
- S. 1006 A bill to end the use of conventional steel-jawed leghold traps on animals in the United States.
- H.R. 701 Conservation and Reinvestment Act of 1999. A bill to provide Outer Continental Shelf Impact Assistance to state and local governments, to amend the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1965, the Urban park and Recreation Recovery Act of 1978, and the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act (commonly referred to as the Pitman-Robertson Act) to establish a fund to meet the outdoor conservation and recreation needs of the American people, and for other purposes.
- H.R. 1202 Captive Exotic Animal Protection Act of 1999. A bill to amend title 18, U.S. Code, to prohibit interstate-connected conduct relating to exotic animals.
- H.R. 1581 A bill to end the use of steel-jawed leghold traps on animals in the United States.
