BIOGRAPHICAL SYNOPSIS

Clint Hackney is a government relations and public law attorney in Austin and was, in the recent past, a political commentator on Texas State Network's "Texas Shootout" radio program.

He was born in Lufkin, Texas where he graduated from high school in 1970. He received a B.A. in Political Science from Texas A&M University in 1974 where he was a member of the Corps of Cadets and Ross Volunteers among other activities.

After undergraduate school, Clint served as a First Lieutenant in the U.S. Army where he was a paratrooper. He studied Comparative Laws at Oxford University in Oxford, England in 1976 and received his law degree from the University of Houston Law Center in 1977.

Mr. Hackney began practicing law in Houston primarily in commercial litigation. He was elected to the Texas House of Representatives in 1980 at the age of 28. He served there for 8 years representing a District in Northwest Houston.

Clint was Chairman of the House Elections Committee and Chairman of the House Energy Committee. Among his handiwork in the legislature he helped rewrite the Election Code in 1985 and later he led the way for construction and management of prisons by private enterprise and played a major role in creation of the Texas Department of Commerce in 1987.

After an unsuccessful statewide race for the Texas Railroad Commission, Mr. Hackney moved to Austin to use his expertise in government and public policy.

Along the way, Mr. Hackney has owned and operated a commuter bus company, served as Director of Cornerstone Savings and Loan, been active with the South West Energy Council and ~~been active in~~ various civic and church groups, and is currently ~~on the Board of Directors of Integrated Savings Corporation and Whole Foods Market, Inc.~~ He also managed to have four children in there somewhere, John age ~~16~~, Jennifer age ~~13~~, Laura age ~~11~~ and Caroline age ~~8~~. He is married to Ms. Laurie Swan who is a professional fundraiser and campaign consultant, ~~who owns her own business.~~ *community affairs*
