Response to #16

Repeal of Helms-Burton law, which strengthened the United States embargo against Cuba.

Held meetings with Senator(s) Blanche Lincoln, Byron Dorgan, Thomas Daschle and Congressmen Roemer, Flake, Cramer and Berman.

H.R. 2138- *Bridges to the Cuban People Act of 2001*- To provide the people of Cuba with access to food and medicines from the United States, to ease restrictions on travel to Cuba, to provide scholarships for certain nationals of Cuba, and for other purposes.

S. 1017- *Bridges to the Cuban People Act of 2001*- Introduced to Senate as stated above.

S.171- To repeal certain travel provisions with respect to Cuba and certain trade sanctions with respect to Cuba, Iran, Libya, North Korea, and Sudan, and for other purposes.

H.R. 2590- Treasury/Postal Appropriations legislation- *Flake Amendment*- To deny the appropriation of funds that enforces the travel ban against Cuba, thereby allowing American Citizens to travel to Cuba freely.
