



HR 775, Y2K Dispute Resolution bill. To establish certain procedures for civil actions brought for damages relating to the transition from the year 1999 to the year 2000. 7/20/99, became P.L. 106-37.

HR 1300, Recycle America's Land Act of 1999. Amends CERCLA to promote brownfields redevelopment; reauthorizes and reforms the Superfund program.

HR 2580, Land Recycling Act of 1999. To encourage the creation, development, and enhancement of State response programs for contaminated sites, removing existing Federal barriers to the cleanup of brownfield sites, and cleaning up and returning contaminated sites to economically productive or other beneficial uses.

HR 2718, Brownfields Remediation Waste Act. To amend the Solid Waste Disposal Act to provide for the management of remediation waste at Brownfields and other remediation sites.

S 96, Y2K Act, Y2K Dispute Resolution. To provide for the orderly resolution of disputes arising out of computer-based problems related to Y2K. See HR 775 for action.

S 880, Fuels Regulatory Relief Act. Removes flammable fuels from the list of substances required to report under the risk management plan program; exempts "worst-case" scenario chemical disaster information from FOIA. 8/5/99, became P.L. 106-40.

S 1090, Superfund Program Completion Act of 1999. Reauthorizes and amends CERCLA and the Superfund program.

S1100, No short title. Reauthorizes and amends the Endangered Species Act of 1973; requires designation of critical habitat be part of the development of recovery.

S 1457, Forest Resources for the Environment and the Economy Act. To amend the Energy Policy Act of 1992 to assess opportunities to increase carbon storage on national forests derived from the public domain and to facilitate voluntary and accurate reporting of forest projects that reduce atmospheric carbon dioxide concentrations.

S 1537, Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1999. To reauthorize and amend the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980.



HR 25, Acid Deposition and Ozone Control Act. Establishes a nitrogen oxide allowance program.

HR 657, Acid Deposition Control Act. Establishes a nitrogen oxide allowance program.

HR 2221, Small Business Family Farms and Constitutional Protection Act. Prohibits the use of Federal funds to implement the Kyoto Protocol until Senate ratification of the Kyoto Protocol; clarifies the authority of Federal agencies to regulate emissions of carbon dioxide.

HR 2520, Credit for Voluntary Actions Act. To authorize agreements to provide regulatory credit for voluntary early action to mitigate potential environmental impacts from greenhouse gas emissions.

HR 2569, Fair Energy Competition Act of 1999. To encourage, support State programs for renewable energy sources, universal electric service, affordable electric service, and energy conservation and efficiency, and for other purposes.

HR 2670, FY00 Commerce, Justice, State appropriations. The bill included Knollenburg amendment, limitation on funds to implement the Kyoto Protocol. See action on HR 3194.

HR 2684, FY00 VA-HUD-Independent Agencies appropriations. The bill included the Knollenburg amendment (a limitation on funds to implement the Kyoto Protocol) and language related to ozone transport, agency lobbying, and environmental justice. 10/20/99, became P.L. 106-74.

HR 2900, Clean Smokestacks Act of 1999. To reduce emissions from electric power plants.

HR 2980, Clean Power Plant Act of 1999. To reduce emissions of mercury, carbon dioxide, nitrogen oxides, and sulfur dioxide from fossil fuel-fired electric utility generating units operating in the United States.

HR 3194, FY00 DC appropriations bill and others. Secs. 336, 568, 583, and 621 - language related to the Kyoto Protocol. Did not include language related to NSR enforcement initiative. 11/29/99, became P.L. 106-113.

HR 3422, FY00 Foreign Operations Appropriations. The bill included Knollenburg amendment, language related to Kyoto Protocol. See action on HR 3194.

HR 3423, FY00 Interior Appropriations. The bill included the Knollenburg amendment, language related to Kyoto Protocol. See action on HR 3194.

S 547, Credit for Voluntary Reduction Act. Authorizes the government to enter into agreements to provide regulatory credit for voluntary early action to mitigate potential environmental impacts from greenhouse gas emissions.

S 673, Omnibus Mercury Emissions Reduction Act of 1999. Establishes requirements on fossil fuel-fired electric utility steam generating units, commercial and industrial boiler units, solid waste incineration units, medical waste incinerators, hazardous waste combustors, chlor-alkali plants, and Portland cement plants to reduce emissions of mercury.

S 882, Energy and Climate Policy Act of 1999. Promotes research to reduce the impact of global climate change.

S 1292, FY00 Interior Appropriations. Included Cochran amendment related to Kyoto Protocol.

S 1369, Clean Energy Act of 1999. To encourage, support State programs for renewable energy sources, universal electric service, affordable electric service, and energy conservation and efficiency, and for other purposes.

S 1776, Climate Change Energy Policy Response Act. To revise US energy policies in order to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, advance global climate science, promote technology development, and increase citizen awareness, and for other purposes.

S 1777, Climate Change Tax Amendments of 1999. To amend the tax code to provide incentives for the voluntary reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and to advance global climate science and technology development.

S 1949, Clean Power Plant and Modernization Act of 1999. To establish requirements to improve the combustion heat rate efficiency of fossil fuel-fired electric utility generating units, to reduce emissions of mercury, carbon dioxide, nitrogen oxides, and sulfur dioxide, to require that all fossil fuel-fired electric utility generating units operating in the United States meet new source review requirements, and to promote alternative energy and clean energy sources.




