Specific Lobbying Issues – Health Care (HCR)**

**Bills from the 108<sup>th</sup> Congress:**

H.R.660 – To amend title I of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 to improve access and choice for entrepreneurs with small businesses with respect to medical care for their employees, all provisions relating to health care. (Rep Ernie Fletcher)

H.R.663 – To amend title IX of the Public Health Service Act to provide for the improvement of patient safety and to reduce the incidence of events that adversely affect patient safety, and for other purposes, all provisions relating to health care. (Rep Michael Bilirakis)

H.R.1910 – To prohibit discrimination on the basis of genetic information with respect to health insurance, all provisions relating to employer sponsored health care. (Rep Louise McIntosh Slaughter)

H.R.3702 – To amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act, as amended by the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003, to provide additional beneficiary protections, all provisions relating to employers. (Rep Benjamin L. Cardin)

S.545 – A bill to amend title I of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 to improve access and choice for entrepreneurs with small businesses with respect to medical care for their employees, all provisions relating to employers. (Sen Olympia J. Snowe)

S.720 – A bill to amend title IX of the Public Health Service Act to provide for the improvement of patient safety and to reduce the incidence of events that adversely affect patient safety, all provisions relating to health care. (Sen James M. Jeffords)

S.1053 – A bill to prohibit discrimination on the basis of genetic information with respect to health insurance and employment, all provisions relating to employers. (Sen Olympia J. Snowe)

S.1992 – A bill to amend the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003 to eliminate privatization of the Medicare program, to improve the Medicare prescription drug benefit, to repeal health savings accounts, and for other purposes, all provisions relating to employers and health savings accounts. (Sen Edward M. Kennedy)

S.1994 – A bill to amend part D of title XVIII of the Social Security Act to strike the language that prohibits the Secretary of Health and Human Services from negotiating prices for prescription drugs furnished under the Medicare program, all provisions relating to employers. (Sen Russell D. Feingold)

S.2520 – A bill to provide for paid sick leave to ensure that Americans can address their own health needs and the health needs of their families, all provisions relating to employers. (Sen Edward M. Kennedy)



S.2710 – A bill to amend the Public Health Service Act to improve the quality and efficiency of health care delivery through improvements in health care information technology, and for other purposes, all provisions relating to employers and health care. (Sen Judd Gregg)

**Other Matters:**

P.L. 108-173/Medicare Modernization Act – provisions relating to retiree health coverage and Health Savings Accounts, urged prompt issuance of proposed regulations, and minimization of administrative burden relating to subsidies to employers

IRS Notice 2004-2 re Health Savings Accounts (HSAs) – in response to request for comments from employers relating to Department of Treasury guidance on HSAs, urging maximum flexibility and minimal administrative burden

29 CFR Parts 1625 and 1627 re Age Discrimination and Retiree Health – urged Equal Employment Opportunity Commission to finalize rule creating exemption to Age Discrimination and Employment Act for coordination of retiree health benefits with Medicare
