H.R. 2210, The Diabetes Prevention Access and Care Act of 2007 – Support entire bill: Would expand resources at NIH and CDC to promote research, treatment, and education regarding diabetes in minority populations.

S. 907/H.R. 1544, The Gestational Diabetes Act (GeDi Act) - Support entire bill; Legislation expands screening, diagnosis collection and treatment of gestation diabetes and the children born from women with gestational diabetes.

S. 1343/H.R. 2241.
