Amend Title XVIII of the Social Security Act to authorize physical therapists to evaluate and treat Medicare beneficiaries without requirement of a physician referral. H.R. 916/S. 438 - Medicare Access to Rehabilitation Services Act. Amend Title XVIII of the Social Security Act to repeal caps on Medicare outpatient therapy services. S. 1356 - Amend Title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide incentives for the provision of high quality care under Medicare. H.R. 985/S. 338 - Establish a bipartisan commission to study and make recommendations for reforming the Medicaid program. H.R. 4078 - Maintaining Medicare Access Act of 2005. Establish a floor for Medicare physician and other provider payment rates under the Physician Fee Schedule for 2006 at the level for 2005. H.R. 3617 - Medicare Value Purchasing Act of 2005. Establish quality and efficiency measures for the Medicare program, provide payment to providers for improving the quality of care, and reward providers for meeting clinically appropriate benchmarks. H.R. 3373/S. 1405 - Preserving Patient Access to Inpatient Rehabilitation Hospitals Act of 2005. Extend until two years after passage of the bill the 50% compliance threshold used to determine if a hospital or unit of a hospital is an inpatient rehabilitation facility. S. 1081 - Preserving Patient Access to Physicians Act of 2005. Prevents 4.4% reduction in the payments to physicians and other Medicare suppliers under the Physician Fee Schedule by providing for a 2.7% payment update for 2006 and 2007. Also corrects the sustainable growth rate (SGR) to avoid projected cuts over the next several years. Payment for physical therapist services under the Medicare physician fee schedule. Medicare skilled nursing facility payment for physical therapist services. Medicare "pay for performance". Proposed quality standards for suppliers of durable medical equipment.
