The interest of the International Underwriting Association (IUA) is similar to that of other large commercial lines insurers and reinsurers. Federal regulation of insurance (including the implementation of the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act) is of interest because of the effect may have upon regulatory compliance throughout the United States. Similarly, as an organization located in a WTO member country, implementation of the WTO financial services agreement may effect its trading position in the United States and elsewhere.
