ACCF lobbyists had contact during the second half of 2000 with various covered officials to discuss tax proposals to eliminate the estate tax, thereby promoting greater saving and investment and mitigating the bias in the tax code against capital formation. Specific legislation included S. 1128 and H.R. 8 to repeal the estate tax and H.R. 1102 to reform the private pension system (later included in H.R. 3081, a package of tax cuts and the minimum wage increase). Lobbying efforts included discussing the principal House and Senate estate tax repeal bills and the House and Senate pension reform measures with covered officials and providing background material.
