- Applies the same work requirements to single- and two-parent families to encourage family formation
- Gives states the option to provide TANF assistance to legal aliens.
- Requires greater coordination between TANF and other federal training, education, housing and transportation programs.
- Allows states to count both refunds and credits provided through state versions of the Earned Income Tax Credit towards the TANF MOE requirement.
- Maintains state flexibility to transfer up to 10% of TANF block grant funds to the SSBG program.
